# Women's Representation in Parliaments in Southeast Europe

29 November 2024



The forthcoming GenPolSEE meeting is dedicated to the research project on women's political representation in Southeast Europe (SEE). The project aims to provide a comprehensive overview of the presence, representation and activities of women in politics across SEE countries in recent decades.

The countries in the SEE region, which have a common history of past communist/social-ist regimes, have followed similar trajectories with regard to gender equality reforms, with the objective of enhancing women's political representation. Despite the numerical gains made by women in politics, there is a paucity of knowledge regarding women's political representation at the local and national parliamentary levels. The objective is to conduct a comprehensive and in-depth analysis of women's political representation in countries in the SEE region that extends beyond mere numerical data on the participation of women in politics.

Subsequent to the thematic event, the annual GenPolSEE meeting will be convened with the network's coordinators. At this meeting, the prospective programme and strategic plans will be discussed.
